

THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF LINCOLN

BY-LAW NO. 2018-98

A BY-LAW TO STOP UP AND CLOSE PART OF THE UNOPENED ROAD ALLOWANCE BETWEEN CONCESSIONS 4 AND 5, LOT 12, IN THE TOWN OF LINCOLN, MUNICIPALITY OF NIAGARA,

WHEREAS pursuant to the provisions of the Municipal Act, 2001, S.O. 2001, c. 25, as amended, the Council of every municipality may pass by-laws for stopping up and closing a highway or part of a highway under its jurisdiction;

AND WHEREAS subsection 34(1) of the Municipal Act, 2001, provides that a by-law permanently closing a highway does not take effect until a certified copy of the by-law is registered in the proper land registry office;

AND WHEREAS the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Lincoln deems it expedient and in the public interest and in accordance with Town of Lincoln Council Policy PL-2017-01 to permanently stop up and close the part of the unopened road allowance between Concessions 4 and 5, Lot 12, in the former Township of Clinton, now Town of Lincoln, Regional Municipality of Niagara, be stopped up and closed.

NOW THEREFORE, THE COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF LINCOLN ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:


1. This Council does hereby permanently stop up and close the portion of highway shown as Part 5 on 30R-15297 and being part of the unopened road allowance between Concessions 4 and 5, Lot 12, in the Town of Lincoln, Regional Municipality of Niagara
2. The Mayor and the Clerk and each of them are hereby authorized and directed to execute on behalf of the municipality all documentation as may be necessary in connection with the stopping up and closing of the said portion of highway and are authorized and directed to effect the registration of this by-law at the proper Registry Office.
3. This By-law shall come into force and take effect on the date of its registration in the proper Registry Office

BY-LAW read a SECOND time this 1<sup>st</sup> day of October, 2018.
