AROUND THE HORSESHOE

Rising to the Challenge in 2022



In Lincoln, we continue to strive for excellence in all that we do, and I see this year as a springboard for even greater things to come.

We have created welcoming and meaningful community spaces for all through investments in parks, culture, and open spaces. Last year, this included the completion of some important community infrastructure projects – most notably Rotary Park, Prokich Park, the Konkle Creek Trail, and the grand opening of the Lincoln Museum and Cultural Centre — Home of the Jordan Historical Museum of the Twenty. Many more community investments are budgeted for this year – stay tuned for more updates as the year progresses.

We will continue to focus on sustainable development and ensuring that when building applications come forward, development aligns as closely as possible with our long-term goals of:



- Creating vibrant urban centres;
- Sustaining a strong economy;
- Ensuring a healthy environment;
- Addressing urban sprawl through infill and higher density development; and
- Creating more opportunities for housing affordability through a variety of housing options.

At the same time, we recognize that provincial and regional policies identify Lincoln as a designated place to grow. Growth must find a balance within these parameters, while protecting our rural areas.

Through **ShopLincoln.ca**, we have supported and promoted local businesses in cooperation with the Downtown Bench BIA and Lincoln Chamber of Commerce. We're excited to launch the new Niagara Benchlands tourism brand in 2022 and draw more interest to our growing local tourism economy.



Advocating for the Lincoln Community

We continue to make strides through our focused and persistent advocacy efforts with other levels of government, demonstrating that a strong local government relations program can truly support our local business community and overall economy.

Town Council and Staff recently attended the 2022 Rural Ontario Municipal Association (ROMA) Virtual Conference. Town of Lincoln delegates met with provincial ministers and MPPs to discuss key priorities, programs, and initiatives to help realize the Town's vision of sustainable economic growth, supported by investments in infrastructure and other important community-focused projects. It was a fruitful discussion that has already lead to confirmed funding for the Senior and Active Living Centre (SALC) to the maximum allowed amount of \$42,700.

Key priorities and projects discussed include additional funding requests for skills training through our Youth Skills Studio in collaboration with Civiconnect, funding for the Niagara Escarpment Crossing to reduce commercial vehicle traffic through core areas, and continued support for our thriving craft beverage industry by urging the province to eliminate the 6.1% tax applied to VQA wines.

Stay Engaged and Empowered

We believe it is important to provide opportunities for community members to engage in real dialogue with staff and Council. To this end, our online engagement platform, **Speak Up Lincoln**, is a place where you can learn more about Town priorities, ask questions and engage with the Town at a time that's convenient for you.



Since we launched Speak Up Lincoln a year ago, the site has welcomed close to 12,000 visitors, and more than 1,000 community members have engaged on our site by filling out surveys, sharing information or asking questions about one of our many projects.

We also encourage you to participate in public meetings and Council/Committee of the

Whole meetings by registering as a delegate.
